Color schemes enable you to understand the relationships between colors and to reliably create appealing palettes. This assignment will test your understanding of basic and advanced color schemes. Use your color wheel for guidance.

Part 1: Identifying Color Schemes

The first question is a sample answer. The purpose of the sample answer is to demonstrate exactly how you are expected to answer the questions in Part 1 of this assignment. Use the sample answer as a guide to help you succeed.

Sample answer: This room uses a complementary color scheme featuring red and green. By using two colors that are opposite one another on the color wheel, the designer creates a space that is varied and interesting. The green creates a cool, earthy atmosphere while the red adds pops of warmth and energy. By using green as a dominant color and red as an accent color, the designer keeps the complementary color scheme from becoming too busy or overwhelming.
